### **Lost property**

A number of you have let me know that your child has lost several items of clothing in school and these items do not appear to be in school.

Can I please remind you to name all clothing that is sent into school with permanent marker or name tapes (these don't wash off) so that we can match items to their rightful owner.

Please also check any clothing that your child brings home to ensure it is theirs – if it doesn't belong to your child please send it back into school as soon as possible. It is understandable that children go home with other children's clothing sometimes but with names in clothes and checking at home, there is no reason that the items can't be returned to their owners.

Over the next couple of weeks we will put out any un-named property on a table on the playground so please have a look and take anything that belongs to your child. We will any clothing that remains to the Bags2School clothing collection later this term.

### **Threadworms**

It has come to my attention that several children in school have had threadworms recently and children are being re-infected. This is a common infection in children under the age of 10. Whilst it is fine for children to attend school with this, it can be passed on very easily. Unfortunately a threadworm infection does not go away on its own – it needs a simple treatment usually from a pharmacy. The link below tells you more about this.
