## **Building Work & Car Park**

You may have noticed that the building work has started and this is planned to be completed by the beginning of September. Safety of the children whilst this work is taking place is a priority. The building site is securely fenced off, school doors with access to the site are out of use and a member of the Sewell Safety Team has been into assembly today to help the children to understand the dangers of building sites. In school, children will be designing their own posters about building site safety and the winning poster from each Key Stage will be displayed on the fencing around the site. There will also be a prize for the winning entries provided by Sewell. Having a building site on the grounds provides a great learning opportunity and Sewell staff are keen to work with the children to help them to learn more about the construction process.

Please remember that in the interests of safety, the car park gates will be closed from 8:20-9am and 2:45-3:15pm.

Please do not park on the double yellow lines on the school drive and avoid driving down Jubilee Terrace if possible as there is very little space to turn around.

Thank you for your cooperation and support with this matter. Children, parents and visitors have commented how much calmer and safer it feels coming to and from school.
