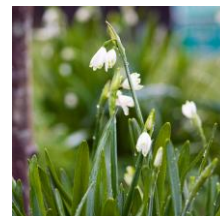

Comic Relief Sponsored Spell

On Friday 13th March we will be having a Comic Relief and School Fundraising Event.

We invite the children to:

- Wear 'something funny for money' – in return for a £1 donation
- Take part in a sponsored spell.

We will be sharing any money raised between Comic Relief and School Fund. School fund helps to pay for school visits, theatre companies and other activities that make the curriculum and learning exciting for the children.

The theme this year is 'funny faces' so children might like to decorate their face or wear a funny hat...

Sponsored spell: Children will have a list of spellings attached to their sponsor form. The number of spellings on the list will vary according to the age of the children. As Comic Relief supports people around the world, some of the words on the spelling list have a geographical theme. Please help your child to learn these spellings. It would also be really useful for children to find out something about the geographical words e.g. locate the places and find out about them or find a picture of their features (e.g. river, mountain). Please make sure that capital letters are used for places. Words will be marked wrong if capital letters are not used.

As these are words that your child should be learning to spell anyway, all children will be tested on their list on 13th March in their classes but we also hope that children will be able to ask for sponsorship from friends and family. Sponsorship could be a certain amount per correct spelling or just an 'all in' amount. We will let you know your child's score once they have completed their test.
