## New Menu



A new lunch menu will begin straight after half term. The menu will be on a 3 week cycle and includes 2 delicious hot choices and a sandwich choice every day. As we are moving into winter there are more hot puddings and custard available too (my favourite!). Remember that all children up to the end of Year 2 are entitled to a free lunch every day, saving parents a great deal of money and giving children a filling, balanced meal. A paper copy of the menu will be sent home later this week and a link to the electronic version put on the app. We will be having a special Halloween themed menu on Monday 31<sup>st</sup> October. This menu will follow soon.

## Water bottles



We encourage children to drink water regularly through the school day and until now, have provided children with their own water bottle which we have filled up and washed. In line with many other schools, we are making some changes to this arrangement. We ask that after half term, parents send in a named water bottle for your child filled with water each morning. This water bottle can be their current school one which we will send home this Thursday or a different bottle. Children will bring their bottle home each day so you will be able to see how much your child has drunk. We will still be encouraging children to drink lots of water and they can re-fill as many times as they like during the day. If children forget their bottle, we will have cups available for them to use in the classroom.

We hope that you have still been collecting stamps from visits to museums, libraries and other out of school clubs.
