Health & Wellbeing

Academy News

As many of you know, last year we consulted on becoming an academy and in the first instance joining Pathfinder Multi-Academy Trust. After a number of due diligence activities carried out by both parties, Pathfinder informed us that they could not accept us as part of their MAT as they do not have the capacity at this current time. Whilst governors have not ruled out the possibility of joining a MAT in the future, we have decided to pause this work and take time to reflect on lessons learned from our consultations and due diligence process so that we make the best choices for St Barnabas in the future.

We recognise the value in working collaboratively with other schools and will continue to benefit from our links with local schools.
