How did we spend our allocation in 2013-14

We bought into the York Schools Sport Partnership. This has enabled us to provide:

- a specialist teacher for ½ day per week for three half terms to work alongside teachers to coach them in developing their own expertise in teaching PE;
- an after school sports club during three half terms
- participation in inter-schools sports tournaments
- ½ day of cricket coaching for 10 weeks through the 'Chance to Shine' programme.
- football skills coaching in curriculum time
- training of Y5/6 Playground leaders to lead games at playtimes

We have funded the cost of after school sports clubs, run by external sports coaches in addition to the one provided above. We have offered a range of clubs over the year for different ages. These have included: KS2 Hockey; KS2 Tag Rugby; KS2 Cross Country; KS2 Tennis

KS1 Multisports; KS1 Gymnastics; KS1 Athletics & KS1 Football c

We have also subsidised the cost of KS2 Breakdancing club. There have been at least two free sports clubs running throughout the year.

The remainder of the allocation was used to:

- Fund York City Knights to run curriculum activities related to sport, exercise and diet for Key Stage 2 children
- Provide subject leader time
- Fund the cost of transport to take part in competitions and tournaments
- Fund a visit for Year 5 and 6 pupils to the cycle track at York Sports Village
- Staff training course (external) on athletics

What difference did this make to sport participation rates and attainment of pupils at St Barnabas?

As a result of offering a wider range and increased number of after school sports clubs, 59% pupils took part in at least one sports club, with the majority taking part in more than one club each week.

Prior to September 2013, St Barnabas pupils rarely took part in any tournaments. When we did take part, the pupils often were not skilled enough to compete fairly. As a result of being part of the York School Sport Partnership, specialist tuition and better planning and preparation for tournaments, the pupils took part in inter-schools athletics (KS1 & KS2), football , cross country and hockey.

There were wins in their group for the Y5/6 football team and the KS1 athletics team. Three pupils were invited to the North Yorkshire cross country finals as a result of

finishing in the top ten in York. As we are a small school, we are generally not able to 'pick' a team to take part in these competitions. Instead we usually take all the children who would like to take part. These wins are a bigger achievement as we often play against much larger schools who can select their team.

As a result of the specialist CPD, teachers have improved their skill and expertise in teaching PE. Last year, the training was focused on gymnastics as this was an area that teachers felt that they needed support with. As a result, teachers feel more confident planning and delivering gymnastics lessons and are better able to support pupils to progress from their different starting points.

Other opportunities to develop PE and Sport at St Barnabas (using school funds – not the Sport Premium funding)

We use a specialist sports coach to deliver one of the class PE lessons per week for most classes, covering teacher PPA time. This means that the pupils receive the highest quality sports coaching.

We invest heavily in swimming and provide one term of swimming lessons to each pupil in years 2, 3, 4 and 5. This means that the majority of pupils are strong swimmers on leaving primary school.

School subsidises other sports clubs that are not fully funded by the sport premium funding.

How do we plan to spend the allocation this year?

We will continue to buy into the York Schools Sport Partnership. This will enable us to provide:

- a specialist teacher for ½ day per week for three half terms to work alongside teachers to coach them in developing their own expertise in teaching PE;
- an after school sports club for at least three half terms
- participation in inter-schools sports tournaments

We plan to continue to offer a wide range and high number of after school sports clubs, provided by external sports coaches.

Specialist support for teachers will be tailored to the CPD needs of the individual teacher.

We will be funding dance specialists to support teachers to deliver dance linking to the curriculum topics.

We intend to further increase participation rates in competitions. Already, pupils have taken part in Y3/4 football tournament as well as KS1 and KS2 athletics competitions. We have appointed a new PE leader, Mrs Taylor. Funding will enable her to carry out monitoring and planning to ensure that the pupils are progressing well and attaining highly in PE.
