Congratulations to the new School Council

Our new School Council members have been elected this week and we are sure that they will do a fantastic job. We are very proud of the children that put themselves forward for election and gave speeches to their class, sharing their ideas about how they would like to improve the school. They were very courageous. The new members will be officially welcomed and presented with their badges at assembly on Friday and parents are invited to attend at 2:15pm.

Learning about Democracy and Parliament

As part of the curriculum, children are required to learn about the specific British Values of *democracy, individual liberty, rule of law, mutual respect and tolerance of those with different faiths and beliefs.*

This week we have marked 'UK Parliament Week' in school through a range of activities:

- Children have elected their new school council members;
- Children have considered issues of national importance and each voted for the one they think is most important. Knife crime received the most votes and older children will now be writing to politicians about this;
 - Shakespeare Class spent the afternoon at Mansion House, meeting the Lord Mayor and Sherriff of York - asking them questions and taking part in activities to learn more about these important roles;
 - Children have learned more about the role of parliament and how laws are made;
- Earlier this term, Anderson class learned about the National Youth Council and voted for an issue they would like to be discussed.

Road Safety

You may have noticed our new bollards on Jubilee Terrace, reminding people to park safely. These are on loan to us from CYC at the moment but we are hoping to buy one of our own. Children learned more about road safety in an assembly led by Christine Packer, CYC travel officer, recently.

This week children will be bringing home their own copy of a book shared at assembly which looks at safety in and around cars in an amusing way. We hope you can look at it together.

Once again, I would like to remind you to avoid parking in Jubilee Terrace as there is limited space, meaning it becomes very unsafe for children. If you do come onto Jubilee Terrace, please park safely and do not block resident's drives.
