

Parents' Evenings Changes

Meetings with all teachers will take place in the hall instead of the classrooms this time. There will be space to wait for your appointment in the hall but children's books will be on display in the corridor at the side of the office. There should be plenty of space to have private conversations with the teachers.

We will review how this new arrangement works so we would be interested in your feedback. Mrs Taylor will still see parents in the classroom for her additional day on Tuesday.

Dance Club will be cancelled on Wednesday 4th March due to Parents' Evenings.

Netball club on Thursday will take place unless it is too wet to go outside.

The Out of School Club will be open for free Stay and Play sessions whilst parents attend the meetings.

Coronovirus

We receive regular updates from Public Health England and will keep you updated as the situation changes. If you have been to one of the affected places / countries, please seek advice from 111 and keep us informed.

The latest guidance (today) is that people who have returned from <u>Category 1 specified</u> <u>countries/areas</u> in the last 14 days should self-isolate. This includes avoiding attending an education setting or work until 14 days after they return.

People who have returned from <u>Category 2 specified countries/areas</u> in the last 14 days, are advised to stay at home if they develop symptoms. All other pupils or students and staff should continue to attend school or university, including their siblings attending the same or a different school (unless advised not to by public health officials).

We will continue to remind children to wash hands regularly and properly and to catch coughs and sneezes with tissues that should then be thrown in the bin. It would be helpful if you could also remind children about this too. Please also be reassured that the cleaning in school is of a very high standard and is frequently monitored by the Local Authority.

Attendance / Leave of absence in term time

A letter about leave of absence / holidays in term time is attached.

At Parents' Evening you will receive information about your child's attendance and lates this year. Good attendance is classed as above 96%. Attendance below 90% is a cause for concern and children are classed as 'Persistent Absentees' by the Department for Education in these cases. Remember that children arriving after 9am have to be marked as an unauthorised absence for the morning.

Donations towards the cost of school visits – please help!

We believe it is really important to take the children on educational visits as this brings the learning to life in a way that we cannot do in school. For example, children can handle real life objects in a museum.

We try to subsidise the visits as much as we can through fundraising but we rely on parental contributions as well. With swimming, we fully fund the cost of the lessons but we ask for contributions towards the coach.

The budget that we receive from the government is not sufficient to cover educational visits as well as essential staffing and resources.

Unfortunately, we have lost a significant amount of money this year as the cost of the visits has been more that the donations we have received. We do not want to stop taking the children on visits but in future, if we don't have sufficient contributions, visits will be cancelled. We are also considering reducing the amount of swimming as this is our biggest loss.

We kindly ask that you check your Parent Pay account and pay any outstanding contributions from visits that your child has been on this year. Many thanks.

Non-Uniform Day Donations

Thank you for supporting the donation and cake sale for the non-uniform day today. Funds raised are shared between school funds – to support special activities for the children and a charity chosen by a class. This time, Malala class have decided to support a charity that helps flood victims.
