I am so proud of the way the children have adapted to their new way of learning. They have tried so hard and produced some wonderful work.


Parents, you have been incredible – supporting learning at home when trying to keep everything else going as well.

Nyong'o Class


Jake has been working so hard on all his learning, but especially his handwriting. **Arwen** has written the inside of her birthday card to Wilbur the penguin beautifully.

TJ and Molly have both worked so hard on their writing this week! They have created beautiful reports on castle defences and written their information independently remembering capital letters and full stops!



Aleksander has made some fantastic contributions in the Google Meets this week. Well done!




Farah Class

Isla J's diary entry was funny and creative and used loads of adverbs!


Lucas works so hard on all our subjects and always hands in work that is accurate, great quality and on time! His adverb acting in our Google Meet was worthy of an Oscar too!



Kahlo Class


Kaleb has been consistently improving his handwriting and working hard to ensure all of his written work is neat and legible, as well as always being a kind friend to everyone in the class.
