We have been very busy in Nyong'o class this week, learning about lots of different things. In Maths we have been learning about position and direction and everyone did so well at placing teddy or Firecracker in the correct position and then explaining that position to me. In Phonics we have been recapping the Phase 3 sounds we learnt last half term (ai ee igh oa oo oo ar or ur ow oi ear). The children continually amaze me with how well they can now spot these sounds in words and then sound and blend to read the words. In Literacy this week we started the story 'Owl Babies'. Everyone was very enthusiastic to write a profile about one of the characters in the story to share with Mr Levick's class!

This term in PE we are starting hockey! Mr Scaling and I were very impressed with how well the children did in their first session and are looking forward to the next one! In RE we looked at a book called '10 things I can do to help my world' and this generated a very lively discussion about whether we turn off the tap when we're brushing our teeth and if it's ok for trees to be chopped down! As a class we are really enjoying our class worship sessions and the children are enjoying taking on more of a lead role in these, doing the welcome and the prayers at the end.

A very happy class to be back was Attenborough this week. They have blown me away with their attitude and getting straight back into their learning. We went straight into our new maths topic: Numbers to 40 and we have been looking at counting up to 40 and introducing the terminology tens and ones. In English we started our new story Little Red Riding Hood and all children gave a prediction for the story, contributed to our class story map and have written some or all of the story! In phonics we have been continuing to 'grow our code', finishing some of our phonics family sounds: le/al=l, c=s, ve=v, o-e/o/ou = u sounds. We practised our previously learnt tricky words and have learnt some new ones: school, call, different and thought. Feel free to practice these at home!

In history this week we learnt all about our current royal family, matching the names to their photographs. In art we were practising our pencil control for fine detail with drawing fish scales and in PE we had our first Dance lesson with Lizzie. We learnt all about our body parts and their senses and how we can move our arms, legs, hips and head and started to learn a dance routine!

In our Wild Wednesday session, we talked about what we need for growing plants and we have planted some seeds! We will keep an eye on them over the next few months to see what beautiful flowers may grow.

What a busy week it has been in Johnson Class. The children have returned ready to learn and have done some exceptional work this week. We have started a new topic in English looking at Fairytales and are using the book "The 3 Little Wolves and the Big Bad Pig." I have loved seeing and hearing the children's expression when retelling the story.

In maths we are finishing off our Money topic and were working on some very tricky word problems this week. The children are getting so good at discussing how to solve a problem and trying different strategies. I think giving change was a hard concept as so much is done on cards these days so any role playing with shops at home would be great extra practise. We also completed our first times table test which the children will try every week to beat their scores. Keep trying to get on Trockstars at home and practise those 2, 5 and 10 times tables.

Year 3 started their swimming this week and were very excited to tell us all about it when they got back. Year 2 have been pushing themselves trying different challenges in our circuits P.E lesson. We had lunges, star jumps, running, skipping and squats. They needed a little rest after all that! Year 2 also started rounders this week with Mr Scaling and I was so impressed with how they developed even after the first lesson.

What an incredible first week back! We have started our new topics in Science - teeth and digestion and in History - the Anglo Saxons. The children have been enthusiastic about all their learning and keen to ask questions to understand and explore more, which is a fantastic start. The photo shows the children exploring how many teeth they have and what types. We then looked at what each type of tooth did - chew, bite or grind food? Some children even demonstrated by eating some bread, apples and..... sweets!

Year 4 has been looking at graphs - how to read them, scales, axis and what data tells us. We've even moved on to drawing our own.

In English, we have been considering the impact famous people might have had on us and we're researching an individual of our choice, ready to write a biography about them. We're currently learning Ms Graystone's mode about the life of Sir Mo Farah (who our class is named after).

Finally, the whole class (and the Year 3 children from Johnson) walked to Bootham School and had their first swimming lesson. We didn't have long in the pool this week as our new swimming teachers wanted to see how confident we were, but next week.....get ready!



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
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Kahlo






Sports Update
