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What does 'RESPECTFUL' behaviour look like?:



- Looking at and listening to the person who is talking
- Waiting patiently for your turn (to talk / to go to the toilet / to get equipment etc)
- Manners 'please / thank you'
- Using kind and encouraging words
- Replying when someone speaks to you (e.g. Good morning)
- Respecting ALL adults, whatever their role in school
- Using indoor voices when inside
- Respecting privacy (e.g. in toilets / when changing for PE)
- Respecting differences and other people's ideas
- Letting adults through doors
- Looking after equipment a- using it how it is meant to be used and tidying it up
- Looking after the school building and displays
- Tidying up after yourself includes tidying your lunch tray / coats on pegs or in lockers
- Sharing responsibility for keeping the school tidy (if you see something on the floor pick it up) even if it's not yours)
- Respecting other people's personal space – keep your hands / feet in your own personal space
- Play fairly take turns choosing games / fair teams / sharing equipment / doing different roles (e.g. being in goal)

This week in Nyong'o Class we have started our learning based on the seaside! Everyone is very excited and wants to know if we are going to have ice cream! In Literacy we watched a creature report from the Octonauts and then all decided which sea creature we would like to research and write about for our whole class information book. I am amazed at all the different things the children already know about life under the sea and the fantastic pages of information they have produced. In Phonics we have been learning about much longer words with different consonant blends e.g. stamp, squelch & strong. Our four new tricky words are 'were, here, little & says'. In Maths this week we have been reviewing our learning on one less and looking at which amounts and numbers are 'greater than' and 'less than'. The cookie monster joined us for our learning and was very grateful to everyone helping him to work out how many cookies he had left after he had eaten one! On Wild Wednesday we reread the story of 'The Three Little Pigs' and then worked very hard to use the natural resources around us to build representations of their three houses. Miss Davison and I were amazed at the wonderful creations the children produced. This week in RE we started to have a look at a special place for Christians to go. The children remembered our visit to the Church for Easter very well and were able to talk about the different things that happen there. Dance was another fun time and I was amazed at how well the children followed Drew's instructions and made up their own mirror dances!

The children were also very excited that we have started to give out dojos for super learning and demonstrating our school rules and values. Everyone has made it to the 'ready' tree and is remembering what this means amazingly well! Very well done Nyong'o Class, another fantastic week of learning!

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Johnson

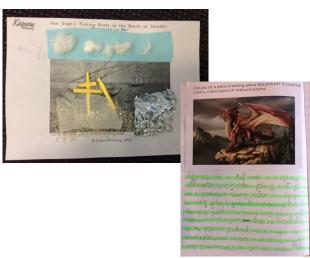

Amazing effort this week.

The children have also started work on collages in art and have been enjoying using different materials to create art. I look forward to seeing what else they can do in the following weeks. 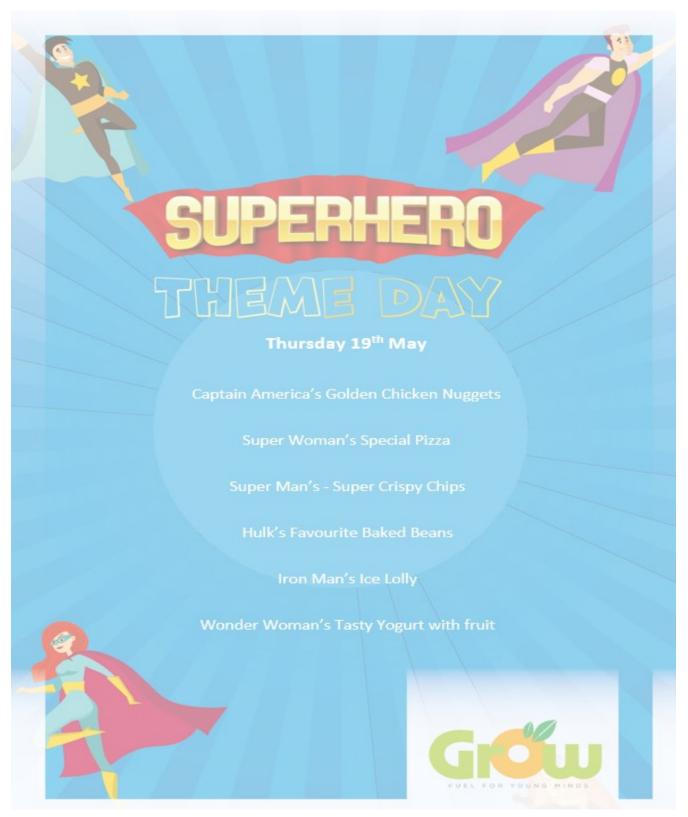
