School Newsletter

A letter from Anne Williamson, Chair of Governors

Dear Families

As we come to the end of another school year, the governors and I wanted to send you an update on our roles in school and the positive progress that we have seen in the last year.

Each governor is a part of a committee, for instance Curriculum, Resources & Finance, Appraisal. Each class also has a Link Governor and there are governors linked to Safeguarding and special educational needs (SEND). This year, as well as attending the governor meetings, each governor has spent time in school so we have been able to see for ourselves the progress that has been made by the children, ask questions of the staff and check the developments within the curriculum offer for the pupils.

We have seen good developments in phonics and maths with the Little Wandle and Maths No Problem schemes being adopted. The PSHE curriculum has been updated along with the History and Computing curriculum. Staff have presented these (and other subjects) to us at our curriculum meetings which helps to assure us that the school is providing a broad and balanced curriculum which coherently and confidently builds on knowledge learned from Reception to Y6. We can then follow this up on our visits. Do check the school website for more information about our school curriculum.

It is a governor's role to be a critical friend, to support and to challenge and we have done this throughout the year in different ways. We have regular governor meetings, but you might have seen a governor at your child's class "Stay and Learn" or at the Celebration Assemblies. We also listen to parent voice and children's voices and ideas throughout the year, so we don't just look at or read lots of data in isolation. We like to know the story of the child behind the numbers. Please chat to us if you see us!

Governors have also attended some of the INSET days in school, met with staff informally to hear what they have to say and been into an occasional staff meeting. Two of the governors come into school regularly to take assemblies, based on our school values. Governors receive the weekly school Newsletter and it's a good way for us to keep up to date with what is happening in each class. Governors can, of course, focus on their link class. I hope you, as families, enjoy hearing about your child's week at school.

This year, we have also been working 'behind the scenes' on moving towards being a part of the family of schools in the Pathfinder Multi Academy Trust (PMAT). The Pathfinder Trust staff have been working with the school this year and we, as governors, are looking forward to joining the Trust knowing that this will bring many advantages and a chance to continue and grow the curriculum offer for the children and staff of St Barnabas.

We know our school provides a safe place, builds resilience in our pupils and has worked to "ignite curiosity and delight in learning" this year. The school also has external monitoring visits throughout the year and at the last one, the children said they enjoy learning, that teachers listen when children need to tell them something and they recognise that they are all different, but it's important to look after each other. The visitor commented that the children on our School Council were "good advocates for our school" and were "living the school values". This was brilliant to hear – thank you to all the children who took part!

As always it has been a busy year and we have had to say goodbye to some members of staff but have welcomed some new staff into the St Barnabas family. We are set to start the new academic year in a good way.

Good-bye and "Good Luck" to our Year 6's as they move on to exciting new adventures at secondary school in September.

The governors and I would like to thank all the staff in school : Miss Boardman, Ms Pena-Haran, Teachers, TAs, the cleaning staff, kitchen staff, Sewell staff and those who join us during the week for PE and dance, for instance, and those who come in to give specialist input to some of the children.

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There have been more enrichment opportunities this year (as covid risks are fewer) with KS2 children taking part in the Shakespeare festival, a chance for classes to go swimming again, residential trips and day trips as well as welcoming visitors and families back into school.

Thank you also, to you as parents and carers, for coming into school for parents' evenings, assemblies, different functions, stay and learn, etc. Thank you for supporting your child's learning at home and their attendance at school. It is so important to reinforce what they are learning in class. If you want to know how you can do this further, please talk to your child's class teacher.

Please do keep in touch with your child's teacher, ask questions and let them know if you are concerned about anything. If we know there have been changes in home circumstance, we can help where we can.

Finally, the governors and I would like to wish you all a happy, healthy and fun-filled summer holiday and we look forward to welcoming the children back, rested and ready for the new year in September.
