This week in computing we have been learning about how to use Information Technology safely. We took photos of each other, remembering to ask for permission and to make sure nobody else was in the shot. The children handled the ipads carefully. In our Geography topic we are learning all about the weather and how it changes in different parts of the UK. On Friday we had a video call with someone in Cardiff, the capital of Wales. The children came up with their own questions to ask about the weather. It turns out it was raining in Cardiff and York!

Farah class have been working hard this week, exploring how fossils are created. We made our own versions out of layers of brown and white bread with a jelly snake or spider as the fossilised creature. We put the sedimentary rock under a lot of pressure and are waiting to find out what happens!

In other news, we have practised editing our first piece of writing and learnt about the flora and fauna in the tundra biome.... not an awful lot... it is freezing cold! The children really surprised me with how much they know and can observe from pictures of the Arctic and Antarctic!

Our reading has produced some great discussion this week, looking at poetry by Amanda Gorman and song lyrics from Sam Cooke. We looked at these through the lens of Black History Month, and the children were very articulate!
