Muddy Monday was a delightful fun session involving hot chocolate! We did a quick reminder about fire safety and what to do in an emergency and then we enjoyed some yummy hot chocolate and the children were great at helping each other with this.

Year 1's have been learning all about the countries of the United Kingdom and different areas of the world including Africa and Brazil - thinking about what it would be like to live there and what the environment looks like.

The reception's have been enjoying some space learning about the different planets, stars and moon in our solar system and using our space role play area to explore space more wildly.








Hadid Ms Pena-Harran & Mrs R Bruce

This week in science we have been learning about microhabitats and how the conditions might be different from the larger habitat that they are in. We explored our outdoor learning area, searching in different microhabitats for minibeasts. The children had some great ideas about what we might find there in different seasons and why.

In art we continued looking at small items such as shells, stones and buttons but experimented with a new technique. We used carbon paper to make a monoprint and looked at how using the pencils in different ways could create a range of effects.

We are also enjoying our new class text - Meerkat Mail and have been looking at the postcards that Sunny sends home.

As part of our English topic (which links nicely with our Science learning about Living things and Habitats), we completed our reading of the wonderful picture book *Last* by Nicola Davies. We learned about how the last rhino she wrote about became extinct. From here, we have started to research a critically endangered species of our own to write a non-chronological report. A key part of this is to write facts and not opinion so we worked with our partners to see if we could sort the sentences out into the two groups. Hopefully, we can use this to write our own facts based upon our research.

In PE and Dance, we continued to use our bodies to create shapes and move between them as part of a sequence. Mr Scaling let us get the apparatus out this week in gymnastics....and the children loved jumping, moving and climbing!
