Are your family up to date on their vaccinations?

If you are planning to travel abroad, especially to Europe, during the half term holidays, please be aware that childhood illnesses such as measles could be circulating.

This week the year 1's have completed their Maths learning on shape and pattern. They have done brilliantly at learning their 2D and 3D shapes, grouping the shapes and creating patterns. The receptions have been looking at the composition of 5 and one more = 6. They have made 6 in many different ways and practised showing 6 with their fingers.

In art this week we looked some more at printing. This time we looked at how we can print using foam. We used a tool to create a flower shape into foam and then printed the flower onto paper. We thought about the different colours for the flowers and how we had to be really careful with the foam so we wouldn't break it.

In the role play area this week we have been astronauts in space going to the different planets in our solar system. We have worn our space boots and flown our rocket away from Earth to our chosen destination!








Hadid Ms Pena-Harran & Mrs R Bruce

This week we have started a new maths topic and we are learning about fractions. We have been investigating how to divide shapes into 2 or 4 equal parts to make halves and quarters. The children have been finding different ways to do this and learning how to write down the fractions.





We have been continuing our work on Meerkat Mail in English and have been planning our own postcard writing from Sunny's point of view. We are remembering our capital letters and full stops and making our writing more interesting by using conjunctions.

We have had another full week continuing our learning within Maths on formal division (in Year 4) and how to convert measurements from mm to cm and cm to metres in Year 3. We can find it tricky to apply this to word problems, so we can make this more practical for real life situations.

The children continue to be fascinated by the research they have done on their critically endangered animals and are turning this into some factual non-chronological reports. Watch this space for the finalised versions and how you can help those poor creatures out with our top advice.

Finally, we began to look at classification keys in Science. Can we write yes/no questions to sort animals so we can identify which is which. To see how this could work, we first created a whole class physical version Guess Who! And then we tried to apply what we had learned using sweets. Could we take a bag of mini Haribo and ask questions to sort them out to identify which is a fried egg vs a jelly ring?

Another great week in Kahlo Class! We've welcomed three brand new students into our class this week. Everyone has been so kind and lovely, and they've settled in brilliantly. Our highlights this week include:

- Diving further into our Shakespeare rehearsals and beginning to practise our parts.
- Investigating how exercise can impact our heart rate by exercising for two minutes and then measuring our pulse.





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More investment in early help for young people's mental health in York

Young people experiencing mental health problems can now access early preventative support thanks to a new service commissioned by City of York Council.

The new service offers a bespoke package of support needs, as well as counselling sessions. The service commenced in Autumn 2022 and has already delivered over 250 counselling hours and supported over 44 young people.

Anyone in need of one-to-one support who is aged 12-25 years can now self-refer for online or face-to-face sessions via York Mind – Young People's Service or be referred by a professional.

Demand for such early help is high and a waiting list may operate from time to time, but the aim is to keep this to a minimum.
