#### **Tax Free Childcare**

We now offer Tax Free Childcare, a government scheme introduced to help with the cost of wrap around care. For every £8 you pay the government will add an extra £2. #### How to book your child's sessions

- 1. Please notify the school office that you have set up a tax free childcare account.
- 2. Work out how many sessions you need to book. Charges are as follows:

Breakfast Club £4.75—7.30am to 8.30am

After School Club Early Bird £5—3.15pm to 5pm

Full After School Club £7.50—3.15pm to 6pm

- 3. Login to your tax free childcare account and make a payment to St Barnabas C E Primary. Please remember to make note of your payment reference number, you will need this to complete our booking form instead of booking on Parent Pay.
- 4. Complete our booking form (link below for May). Going forward they will be sent out to you on the 1st of every month. You will need to book all sessions a month in advance. If you need to book an extra session at short notice, please submit another form and this will be picked up in the school office.

We have had another brilliant few weeks in Attenborough.

The reception children have been writing some brilliant sentences about King Charles and the coronation. The Year 1s have been writing some fantastic descriptions of the Woodcutter from Little Red Riding Hood.

In Geography this week we looked at why we have maps and what they are used for. We also talked about how we can follow directions without a map, like finding our way around school.

Last week we celebrated the King's coronation with the rest of the school by making our very own crowns and enjoying our school picnic.

In music in recent weeks we have been learning to play the glockenspiels. We have been practising holding the beater correctly and finding the notes. The children have played notes in sequence together to accompany a song.

Last week, we were also lucky to have a samba drumming workshop. The children created a range of rhythms with different percussion instruments, working together in small groups. They really enjoyed it and made us proud with their engagement with this activity.





This week in English we have started our new unit all about wolves. We will be writing a non-chronological report including lots of interesting information about wolves. Feel free to do your own research on this at home. Mrs Bruce and Ms Pena Harran would love to hear about what you find out!

In Maths we have been working hard on learning to tell the time. We look at the minute hand first and use our counting in 5s to work out what the minutes are. Then we see where the hour hand is. It would be very helpful if you could practise this at home.

The children have continued their learning in Science on the topic Light. Last week we had an expert in to talk to us about the human eye. Lucy from Specsavers taught us about what the eye is made up of and how it works..... Upside down images! Wow!

This week, we used torches to work out if materials were opaque, transparent or translucent. As you can see, many children were fascinated to see what happens as they grouped items.

We have also completed our letter to the King from our story *The King Who Banned the Dark*. We are persuading him to put the lights back on, and telling him the impact his decision is having on nocturnal animals, electricity bills and exhausted children in school!
