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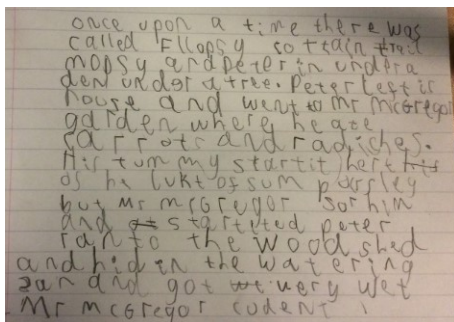
Attenborough — Miss Davison

In their writing there are some wonderful suggestions of what to do if you encounter a wolf - climb a tree, call a huntsman or just stay still and hope it doesn't see you! Mrs Bruce and Ms Pena Harran are very proud of the way the children have developed their writing through all our work through our wolves topics. Well done!

In our maths this week the children have been working really hard on applying a range of calculation strategies to different problems. They have been using a range of strategies including using practical resources, jottings and column methods. They have worked well together in pairs to support each other's thinking. We would really appreciate it if you could help at home by practising lots of counting in 2s, 5s, 10s and 3s.
