Learning in Farah Class Spring 2024

Topics: Rivers, States of matter, Still life, Electricity, Judaism, The Romans.

In Science, we will be learning...

- All about the three different states of matter: solids, liquids and gases.
- To compare and group materials together.
- To observe that some materials change state when they are heated or cooled.
- To construct a simple electrical circuit.
- To identify machines which use electricity.

In Geography we will be learning....

- The names of key rivers in the UK and their locations.
- Features of a river and its journey from source to mouth.
- About the water cycle.
- Enjoying a visit from the 'River Van'

In History, we will be.....

- Studying the Roman civilisation and its impact on the world, and more locally, on York.
- Understanding how the Romans fit into our historical timelines.
- Visiting the Yorkshire Museum to see Roman artefacts.

In DT, we will be ...

 Linking our learning on electricity to design, make and evaluate a burglar alarm system.

In Art, we will be....

- Exploring how artists create still life paintings.
- Comparing contemporary styles to create still life, with those in the past.
- Making our own 'still life' drawings and paintings.

In English we will be...

Developing our writing skills by:

- Using persuasive skills in a letter format (flattery, pronouns, emotive language and subordinate conjunctions since, although, because)
- Writing dilemma stories.
- Writing a character description.
- Writing explanation text (using facts, planning carefully, using chronological order, adverbs)


Improving our spelling by: looking at homophones (words that sound the same, but have different spellings and different meanings (e.g ate/eight (Y3) or piece/peace (Y4). We will also consider different prefixes and how they change the meanings of words (e.g in Y3: mis, re, pre and in Y4 il/im/in/ir). Suffixes won't be forgotten, so we'll look/review the meanings of -ful and -ness when added to the end of a root word,


Developing positive attitudes to reading and improving comprehension by:

- Reading in groups or individually in class and to another adult.
- Discussing what we have read and looking for clues in the text to answer questions and justify our views.

Our main texts this term are in the images:

A range of texts including extracts from stories and non fiction texts will be used in our Guided Reading lessons.





In Maths we will be...

Developing our mathematical knowledge and skills by:

- Multiplying 2-digit numbers together.
- Dividing 2-digit numbers.
- Multiplying and dividing with renaming.
- Multiplying 3 numbers together.
- Multiplying and dividing numbers by multiples of 10.
- Identifying different kinds of angles in shapes.
- Finding equivalent fractions, simplifying fractions and comparing fractions.
- Telling the time using the minute and hour hands.
- Knowing the value of Roman numerals, including on a clock.

We will be spending lots of time consolidating the children's \boldsymbol{x} tables knowledge.

In Year 3 we will be revising the 8 x tables and learning the 3 x tables In Year 4 we will be revising the 7 x tables and learning the 11 x tables.

If your child is unsure of any of these x tables, please could you practise with them at home? A great way to practise is by accessing times tables rockstars.

Multiplications Tables: Being secure in your multiplications tables facts is really important to help with fluency in maths. Children who can recall their times table facts easily and quickly, find it easier to solve problems with their knowledge and to make links across topics.
