In P.E we have started our new units of basketball (outside) and gymnastics (inside).



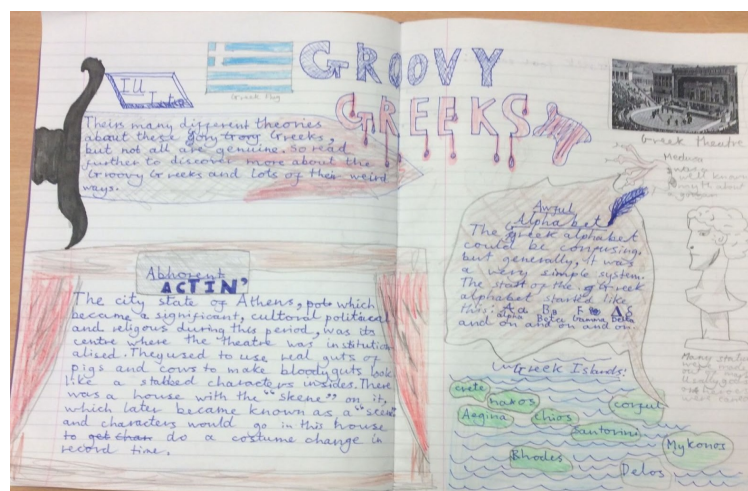
