18-19th March—Egg Decorating Competition. Winners announced at Easter Service on 20th



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We will be celebrating World Book Day in school on **Wednesday 6th March.** 


Children are invited to come to school dressed as a book character. This is optional as we understand that some children prefer not to dress up. Children may like to bring an item related to a book character instead....
